

Junction – 2022 CALL FOR ENTRIES The 25th Annual Architectural Model Exhibit

Junctions are most commonly a place to come together, marking a convergent place where two becomes one. When each party comes together to contribute to a greater whole, these unions can generate synergy. By building new connections between previously disparate objects, ideas, people, and disciplines, junctions present opportunities to celebrate how harmony can emerge from collaboration. When Covid-19 first emerged, no one could've anticipated how isolated we would soon become, how desperately we would seek one another and how we would cling to the remnants of a fractured way of existing. As life slowly takes a hopeful shift, we can take that brisk step forward and meet as we once did, face to face. What spaces celebrate reconnection?

At the same time, a junction can be understood from the converse direction. They are also places defined by shifting paths, like a stream splitting or one road meeting another, where the one can become two. 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2022 ENTRY GUIDELINES

How do I submit an entry?


- Please submit your entry proposal through our online submission form.
 - Please follow the naming format: ProjectTitle _ Firm/Individual Name _ Entry # of total # submitted ex. "DogHouse_ Architects.R.US_Entry 3 of 5"
- o Include images and sketches in your submission:
 - Link to or upload entry images in your submission form or send 1-2 images/sketches of the proposed work to marina@seattlearchitecture.org

How many entry proposals will be selected?

- The Center for Architecture and Design offers a range of opportunities for the display of architectural models and renderings based on the layout of our gallery.
- Depending on the proposed size of entries submitted, we anticipate accepting up to 5 entries for the Front Window Spaces, 12 entries for Interior Gallery Spaces, 16 2D Project Boards, and 2 digital pieces.
- o Entries may be suspended from the ceiling provided the installation is done by the exhibitor.

What entry proposals will be accepted?

- Proposals that illustrate the design process in any medium. This could include hand-made models, 3D printed models, VR, framed sketches, digital renderings, data or site analysis, plans, perspective drawings, interactives, or photo documentation. We are very interested in conceptual work in addition to work produced for presentation purposes. This work does not have to be completed at the time of submission all we need is a proposal and for the finished work to meet our submission guidelines.
- **Digital Work** should be less than 3 minutes in length and include opening titles that include: Project Title, Location, Design Team, and Firm- closed captions preferred.
- 2D Project Boards will need to be customized for exhibit display. Required information includes: Project Title, Location, Design Team, Firm, and project description.
 - Optional Board Orientations: not to exceed 36" x 36"



• How will my entry statement be used in the curation of the exhibit?

 Your entry description will be used to develop exhibit labels for all physical models and digital work. Your entry statement should be no longer than 150 words but you are welcome to send us additional background information about your project via a link to a website.
