








DISPLACEMENT **RISK INDEX**

King County SEATTLE




28% Percent of **Black** households own their own home in King County

63% Percent of White households own their own home in King County





Surging rents and lack of access to affordable ownership are forcing out many of Seattle's longtime residents and businesses. This area has historically been home to immigrants, refugees, and communities of color, who continue to face systematic exclusion from opportunity.





Othello Square consists of four buildings on 3.2 acres and will house a mix of organizations and services that meet the needs of residents and the surrounding community – as determined through a series of community meetings – all in one place.





Prior to architectural design, the master plan articulated the community's desire to create public space that fosters community interaction. The node concept established a language that each of the four parcels would use to organize programs and capitalize on synergies.

Mechanical manipulation of ropes, threads, fabrics Creates knots, tapestries, woven elements










TOAD LILY OPALS RATING: 2

Othello Square's plant palette embodies the community's diversity and commitment to equity. Plant selection prioritizes cultural and ethnobotanical relevancy while reducing allergy barriers. Plant allergies are amplified for populations made vulnerable by higher levels of air pollution in urban areas.

GUIDING PRINCIPLE 1: Reflect the history and traditions of the Othello neighborhood as a place that has always been welcoming to all people.

MASTER PLAN GUIDELINES:

- 1. Convey a sense of inclusion and belonging through human scaled elements
- 2. Emphasize important gateways and visual anchors
- 3. Avoid gates and fences
- 4. Incorporate weather coverage whenever possible
- 5. Create welcoming thresholds at building and site entries

Master Plan Implementation:

Architectural and landscape elements should be human scaled to help welcome people to the site and emphasize inclusion and belonging. A series of gateways, visual anchors, and thresholds have been identified across the site to draw people in, and create connections through the site, and into the buildings. The gateways and visual anchors should help to express character and identify this as a unique place in the neighborhood. Site gateways should be created using a longer threshold, or a sequence of spaces which lead users into the site. Building thresholds should be treated carefully and emphasize interior/exterior connections, and welcoming entries. Weather coverage should be included whenever possible and especially at building entrances. Covered areas should provide flexibility, allow for planned and spontaneous activity throughout the year, and provide pedestrian comfort. Avoid gates and fences to allow the site to feel welcoming to all people by avoiding physical barriers.



The Master Plan concludes with a synthesis of the community's guiding principles with spatially-focused master plan guidelines. Simple graphics ensure effective communication across project teams and preservation of both big picture intentions and the finer aspects of the site.
